We invest and are active partners in the following Collaboratives—groups of community partners working on shared, long-term solutions for families with young children (prenatal to age 8) throughout Snohomish County.

Donors to the CORE Fund are committed to making our community a better place for all its residents. When you invest in our five CORE Collaboratives, you are supporting a new approach to solving poverty. Rather than meeting one need that a child may have today, you are helping whole families find success every day and for generations to come. We invite you to join us and invest in something different.

### CASINO ROAD ALL FAMILIES ARE READY



Ensures families with young children are ready to thrive in school. Their physical hub, The Village on Casino Road in South Everett, offers adult education, parent/caregiver support, early learning, small business development, etc. A coordinator helps each family connect with the resources to achieve their individual goals.

### HOMeward HOUSE



Nurtures the vital parent-child bond in the face of crisis, treatment, and recovery. Families have supervised visitation while both mom and baby receive on-site support services in a home-like setting in Everett that's conducive to bonding and attachment.

### IMPROVING SCHOOL ATTENDANCE FOR FAMILIES IN TRANSITION



Increases opportunity and engagement in education for children experiencing transition so that the cycle of homelessness and poverty is not repeated. Family, Child Family Advocate, and school develop a plan and work together so a chronically absent child in transition is ready for school.

### MAKING LIFE WORK



Helps Stanwood-Camano families experiencing poverty become stable and self-sufficient, and ensures their children attain early educational success to lay the foundation for school and beyond through monthly workshops, education and employment skill building, and mental health services.

### NORTH COUNTIES' COMMUNITY COLLABORATIVE



Reduces poverty for households with children ages 0-8 in the Darrington community by investing in wellness, self-sufficiency, and education. NCCC brings new services to Darrington to fill gaps in supports for the whole family.

Working together with a parent who can see how the pieces can, and will, fit together can make a life-altering difference—one that helps someone's children today, and their children's children in the future.
