ADVOCACY PRIORITY: EARLY CHILDHOOD EDUCATION

The 2021 Fair Start for Kids Act advances early learning access and affordability for Washington families, but the positive impacts have not been felt by Snohomish County families and providers yet. In 2022, we must:

- Ensure investments and implementation of the Fair Start for Kids Act centers the needs of families and providers and includes opportunities for input and feedback.
- Guarantee high quality, culturally and linguistically relevant, affordable early learning for all children, especially Black, Indigenous, and families of color.
- Advance family stability and economic recovery by providing working families with early learning and childcare options that meet their needs.
- Support stability for early learning providers and provide living wages for the early learning workforce.
- Reduce the benefit cliff effect of childcare subsidies.
